Hymn Review (Robert Brown) "Make me a Channel of Your Peace" Hymn #753

This hymn has often been attributed to St. Francis of Assisi. There is no evidence of a connection to him other than that the tone of this prayer agrees with his life. It was first printed in the USA in 1920. It speaks to our wish and prayer to be a peaceful person and a servant to others.

150th Anniversary History Tidbit (Janean McKay) Backpack Ministry

Each school year area teachers make lists of supplies that students are expected to bring to class the first day of school. The lists are available at area stores. Not all families can afford these supplies especially if there are a number of students in the family. For 12 years, through private donations, the First Presbyterian buys supplies for low income students in the Redwood Area School District. In 2008 project volunteers bought out Wal-Mart Supplies and were forced to go to Marshall to complete the shopping for 121 backpacks. Then church members ages 5 - 91 walked around the dining room tables ladened with supplies filling bags with the items needed for each class level which ranged from kindergarten to eighth grade. In 2016 donations allowed First Presbyterian to pay out \$3,677 for this project filling 198 backpacks. The church was able to donate extra supplies to the Early Childhood Department also.

Giving back to the community in this way has now become a project for Garnette Gardens and Verizons also. This is one way the saying "It takes a community to raise a child" is being fulfilled as a local mission project.
