# 150th Anniversary History Tidbit (Janean McKay) Presbyterian Women

Historically, women of all church denominations gathered as a separate body in the life of their churches. The Presbyterian women's organization went by various names which changed with national mergers. Ladies Aid, City and Country Mite Society (showing the power of the smallest coin donation), Presbyterian Women, Presbyterial, Synodical and now Presbyterian Women of the Church, of the Presbytery, Synod, etc.

In Redwood Falls, women gathered the first Wednesday of each month, had officers that planned programs, did mission work as a group, and had fund raisers to support Christian work and the building. Circles were formed for the major purpose of Bible Study. They had a separate checking account but were under the umbrella of the Session and reported monthly to that group.

As it became more accepted for the women in Redwood Falls to be members of Session and the Deacons, the church membership declined, and more women are woking outside the home. It was decided in the early 1990's to downsize to just Circles. The men and women were working together in the Christian work of the congregation. Their money was turned over to the General Fund with the agreement that the Bible Study materials be paid for by the local church funds. There is still an active arm of Presbyterian Women in all levels of the Presbyterian church. Women who belong to a Presbyterian Church are considered part of the Presbyterian Women organization. There is a strong emphasis on missions as has been true historically. Women who have contributed to work as officers or committee work have received honorary Women's Association pins. Traditionally, Redwood women honored at least one woman a year. Presbytery meets at different geographical locations and Redwood Falls has still hosted officer's meetings. There has been a fall overnight retreat at Green Lake Bible Camp, which is more centrally located.

There is a national web site, a national magazine called "Horizon," Church-wide mission work, a Church-wide Triennium, and an assigned sister church in the United States. All of this binds the Presbyterian Women of the World into a Christian force of witness and charity.

# Hymn Review (Robert Brown) "The Star Spangled Banner"

This hymn was originally written as a poem by Frances Scott Key while he was sitting on a British ship in the harbor. He was unable to go ashore but after a night of heavy shelling, he was surprised to see the stars and stripes still flying over the American fort.
