Hymn Review (Robert Brown) Hymn #761 "Called us Partners in Christ"

This hymn was written to promote the unity of the General Assemblies of United Presbyterian Church USA and Presbyterian Church US, 2 years before they untied. It speaks to many kinds of painful, needless and inappropriate discussions in the faith community.

150th Anniversary History Tidbit (Janean McKay) The Redwood Area Ministerial Association

A 1937 Redwood Gazette article tells about "the Ministerial Council indicative of a cooperative spirit...of the pastors of Redwood Falls formed a Council in December, 1923 for the purpose of organizing religious classes for the school children. This tells us that early in the history of Redwood Falls the local pastors from area churches of various denominations worked together for the cause of Christ and the betterment of our community.

A few examples of this are: Pastors rotate giving daily devotions on KLGR. The same is true with a devotional column in the Redwood Gazette. For many years they sponsored a Baccalaureate service for local high school graduates. There was a community prayer service for rain during a prolonged drought. On Good Friday there is an ecumenical service with local pastors taking part in the service. The location rotates with churches. At the assassination of President Kennedy there was a service of remembrance and mourning at the high school gymnasium. Community residents filled the gym. They co-sponsor lyceums at the local school with a message for a positive life for youth.

These are only a few of the events over the years but the pastors of First Presbyterian Church have worked faithfully with others in the community. The Methodist Church and our church has had a shared Thanksgiving service many years until 2016. The churches rotated the location of the service each year. The minister of the other church gave the sermon. There was a mass choir from both churches. In 1948 there began a joint Vacation Bible School with the Methodist Church. Then in the 70's and 80's First Presbyterian had their own. The last decades several churches in town have a joint Bible School with the location rotating each year.
