This verse from the book of Matthew is the principle guiding force behind the mission program at the First Presbyterian Church. Through our mission efforts, we help Christ's hurting people wherever the Holy Spirit directs our help.



Our mission activities are divided into four categories which are:

1. International
2. National
3. Regional (within the Synod of Lakes and Prairies)
4. Local (mostly throughout Redwood County)

In addition, one half of our mission/tithing collection goes to the Presbytery of Minnesota Valleys, Synod of Lakes and Prairies and General Assembly for mission support. Also in addition to our tithing and pledged mission fund, individuals donate money to missions of their choosing.

Guatemala Scholarships



Since 1992, the Presbytery of Minnesota Valleys has had a partnership with the Occidente Presbytery, in Guatemala. One of the ways PMV congregations support them is through their pastors. Many are not paid very well. They are tent maker style pastors, some are farmers, and others have lower paying jobs. Money is scarce. Many of the churches are very small. 16 Congregations in the Presbytery help the pastors by providing funds to help them educate their children. The money is used to buy uniforms, books, school supplies and sometimes shoes. \$250 (plus the admin fee for transferring the funds) may not seem like much to

many of us, but for them it is a lot and it encourages them to keep their children in school. They are so grateful for the funds. Please keep these pastors and their families in your prayers.

Roblealto Child Care Association

The First Presbyterian Church Mission Committee sponsored a child at Roblealto.

The Roblealto Child Care Association is a Christian, public welfare, non-profit organization founded in 1932. From the beginning, its mission has been to care for the children of Costa Rica who are in critical situations and in need of specialized care and integrated services so they are able to reach their full potential.

While the children are being cared for, their parents are receiving support from Roblealto's interdisciplinary team, in order to cut the cycles of poverty and dysfunction in one generation.

Since 1932, thousands of children have received comprehensive care in the areas of health, nutrition, education, spiritual and emotional support and psychological treatment.

But especially, our children and their families have received the love and understanding they need from the Roblealto staff; committed professionals that share Christian values with them, which will help them function successfully in society.

What does sponsorship mean to a child at Roblealto?

It means that someone loves that child and thinks he or she is special. Someone has chosen to invest in the life of a child and pray for and encourage him or her. This is especially significant, since many children come to us at Roblealto with very low self-esteem and many of them do not receive that kind of love, encouragement and warmth from their families at home. When a child finds out his or her sponsor wrote, his/her eyes light up and a huge smile spreads across his/her whole face! Sponsorship is a means of directly transforming a child's life with Christ's love.

You have the opportunity to impact a life forever through Roblealto's Sponsorship Program! This Program is the backbone of Roblealto and the way we assure our kids the integrated attention they need, given by professionals. More than just feeding and giving shelter to the children and their families, Roblealto works actively in sharing the Christian vision of life. At the same time, we offer them tools to cut the cycles of dysfunction and poverty and to have a better quality of life. Roblealto will provide you with a yearly progress report and an updated picture of your child from their birthday month.

Presbyterian Disaster Relief (Hurricane Relief)

With the 2018 Atlantic Hurricane Season, we saw a total of 15 named storms, 8 of those being hurricanes, and 2 storms reaching MAJOR hurricane strength.

The heavy hitters this year were Florence and Michael, both of which moved through the CSRA at some point in their journey. Florence caused catastrophic flooding through the Carolinas and Michael forever changed the landscape of the Florida Panhandle and south Georgia.

Florence (September 2018)

- 32 storm related deaths
- 35.93" of rain recorded in Swansboro, NC (New North Carolina record - most rainfall from a tropical system)
- 34" of rain recorded in Marion, SC (New South Carolina record - most rainfall from a tropical system)
- Around \$17.9 billion in damage so far

Michael (October 2018)

- 43 storm related deaths
- Strongest storm in recorded history to ever hit Florida Panhandle (Max Winds 155mph)
- 4th strongest storm to hit US on record (based on central pressure at landfall)
- Around \$15 billion in damage so far

Jail & Bail Ministry

On June 19, 2018, during General Assembly, hundreds of Presbyterians, including Julia Prouty, marched over a mile through the streets of downtown St. Louis where the temperature was 94 degrees with a heat index surpassing 100 degrees. The heat didn't dampen the spirit of the crowd, who boldly chanted "End cash bail!" as they made their way to the City Justice Center. They were there to deliver a message – and a check for \$47,200 for bail relief. The money came from the offering collected during the assembly's opening worship. The offering taken during opening worship at previous assemblies has generally totaled \$13,000-18,000. This offering was more than triple that. Working with local networks in St. Louis – the Arch City Defenders and the Bail Project – the offering will purchase freedom for people held under bench warrants and minor offenses as they await trial. It gets them back to their jobs, to their families and to their communities.

When is the CJ offering received? The Christmas Joy Offering is traditionally received during the Advent Season.



Safe Avenues



Shelter House began in 1978 as a program of Woodland Centers, a non-profit mental health center serving West Central Minnesota. In 1995, the agency added Harmony Visitation Center which provides parenting time services. The agency also added domestic violence community advocacy programs for Kandiyohi, Renville, and Swift Counties, and the Criminal Justice Intervention Program. In 1999, Shelter House became an independent 501(c)(3) agency. That same year, domestic violence community advocacy programs were added for Chippewa, Lac qui Parle, and Meeker Counties.

In May 2005, after a successful capital campaign, the Shelter opened its doors to a 16 bed emergency shelter. Later that year, Shelter House added youth programming and began providing sexual assault victim advocacy services in

Swift, Renville, and McLeod counties. In 2006, sexual assault victim advocacy services were added for Kandiyohi County.

In 2010, Shelter House officially changed its name to Safe Avenues to better reflect the services provided and the various avenues to safety.

Today, Safe Avenues provides advocacy, parenting time services, and emergency safe shelter to victims of domestic and sexual violence.

Thank you! I cannot adequately express my appreciation for your unexpected financial contribution to the University of Jamestown campus ministry fund. Last year, the school made a significant decision to hire me, as their full-time chaplain. They hadn't had a full-time chaplain for numerous years. This meant they took a step of faith to do so. This decision significantly stretched their budget. Unfortunately, they were and are only able to budget \$3,700.00 for campus ministries. This amount is to cover all programming expenses and my continuing education experiences. Thankfully, God has had blessed the ministry with gifts such as yours.

Our campus ministry is robust and growing. As chaplain, I offer a wide variety of ministry opportunities including: Cross Training (athletes & faith), Faith & Life chat (discussion of contemporary issues from a faith perspective), Bible study for faculty and staff, "Building Up" events (missional outreach), worship and a Habitat for Humanity group. I have the joy of working with four campus ministry teams: worship design, music ministry, spiritual formation and fellowship and missional outreach.

I spend a significant amount of time meeting with students one-on-one and providing pastoral care. The needs are varied and great. Willmar Church "Family Promise"



How It Works: The Family Promise Program provides more than just shelter. We help homeless families cope with their current housing crisis and teach them life-skills that will enable them to return to independent living and self-sufficiency. Guests in the program are served during the day at our Day Center and are transported by van to Host Congregations at night. Congregations are only available in the evenings from 5:30 pm until 7 am. Unless working, guests arrive at the Host Congregation,

usually by the Family Promise van, between 5:30 and 6 pm, each evening. There, volunteers will prepare and serve our families meals and provide safe sleeping quarters. Every night dinner is served family style at approximately 6 pm; items are available to pack sack lunches for the following day, and each morning breakfast is served before guests leave the Host Congregation. During the week, guests learn life-skills tied to job readiness/retention, tenant aspects, budgeting, healthy communities and nutrition. Each morning, at 7 am, the families are transported back to our Day Center, where they search for jobs and housing, and receive case management support as they work on self-sufficiency plans. On Sundays, families pack up their belongings and volunteers move the beds and luggage to a new congregation where each family will stay for another week. Family Promise offers assessment, service planning, referrals, and advocacy to our guests. The Director and the family develop individualized self-sufficiency plans as a team. All adults continually work on their goals. A family's stay in the program is contingent upon positive participation and active efforts toward goal achievement. Typically our guests graduate from the program in 2 or 3 months.

All people deserve to eat, regardless of the choices they've made or the hands they were dealt in life. No one can grow, maintain good health or reach their full potential if they are hungry. A surprising number of our neighbors are doing something they never imagined – visiting one of our agency partner's food shelves for the first time in their lives.

Who is hungry?

Working families: totaling more than half a million people visit food shelves.

Children: are more than 33 percent of the people you help.

Seniors: are the fastest-growing segment of the population visiting food shelves.

Post-secondary students: use food shelves at a time when they have very few resources.

We just wanted to send a note of thanks for the family pool pass. We've used it many times already and anticipate going even more as other activities end. This is an incredible blessing to our family and we are all so grateful for it.

The First Presbyterian Church Angel Fund

The First Presbyterian Church of Redwood Falls will now be hosting funerals for children free of charge to the family of the deceased child. Our church will donate food for the funeral luncheon, as well as the labor of the pastor, the musician, and the luncheon servers. The average cost of these services is about \$2,500 per funeral. We are very thankful for the privilege of being the comforting hands of Christ in this way to a grieving family. In order to provide these services a special fund, The Angel Fund, has been set up. Money can be donated directly to this fund by writing "The Angel Fund" in the memo line of your check, or on the offering envelope. Children's Weekend Food Bags



When our church started filling food bags for elementary children, the percent of children receiving free or reduced lunch meals was approximately 35%--the current percent is around 75%. With the changing needs of the children in our community, food bags are becoming more and more important. This is an important part of the mission work we do in our community.

Our weekend food bags supported many children and families in 2018. Again partnering with the United Methodist Church, we packed 1,935 bags of food in 2018 for children (First Presbyterian Church packed approx. 967 bags). Our weekly bag totals ranged from 48-56, serving approximately 40 different families (each child in a family is given a bag of food). The bags contained over 15,000 lbs of food total. A typical bag might contain a can of Ravioli or Beefy Macaroni, a can of corn or beans, a can of applesauce or pears and 2 pkgs of ramen

noodles or macaroni and cheese. Because we are able to order food through our local food shelf, we are able to keep the average cost per bag at about \$2.12. We also send home breakfast items home for each family several times each month. We might send pancake mix and syrup (approx. cost \$1.60/family) or peanut butter (\$1.18) or cereal (\$1.68/15 oz box). Our total cost for the year is about \$5,000 (half of which is paid by the Methodist Church). We constantly discuss how to improve the bags and attempt to give them more healthful options, because of shelf life and storage, our options are limited.

Thank you to those that have helped transport bags to the school, packed bags in church, brought in grocery bags or donated money to help continue this ministry.

Friendship Dinners

As a continued outreach project the First Presbyterian Church offered a free dinner to the community during the months of January through May and again for Christmas Eve.

Share the Spirit

Choices Pregnancy Center "Change For Life" Campaign

I was privileged to visit your church on the last Sunday of September, and to encourage your congregation to take part in the goal of filling baby bottles with change to benefit Choices Pregnancy Center.

I am happy to report back on your church's contribution! For those that participated, \$376.98 was collected! Combined with nine other area churches, the impact of the baby bottle campaign in 2018 has now reached over \$5,000! The funds are immediately put to work, benefiting the mothers, fathers and babies that we serve. In the last three months alone, Choices Presence Center has proved 2 free pack-and-play cribs to women that needed a state spot for their baby to sleep, 5 lessons on health nutrition, over 20 pregnancy related lessons and over 50 parenting education lessons! In addition, we have supplied nearly 350 different items to our clients of our Baby Buck Boutique! As you have participated in collecting "Change for Life", you have partnered with us to provide these services at no cost to our clients. We are extremely thankful!

Again, please accept my thanks for your participation during the past month; what may seem a small amount of change added up to a big difference in the lives of families in our community!

Our church also has a food shelf grocery cart in the back of the sanctuary to collect food all year long. Our youth does a winter food scavenger hunt throughout the community to add to your collections.

Dear First Presbyterian Church, We would sincerely like to thank you for your donation. It is people like you that give our food shelf the ability to stock our shelves with healthy food to distribute to our clients.

We serve approximately 150-160 families every month with one third of the individuals in the age range of 0-17. With our connection with Wal-Mart, we are able to serve our clients fresh fruits and vegetables as we pick up food supplies from them each day we are open. We also have been given donations which have been designated to be used for our milk program. As we do not have space to store fresh milk, we give what we refer to as a milk voucher to our clients. They in turn go to our local grocery store and pick up a gallon of milk paid for by our donors. Together we have made our food shelf a safe and secure place for people in need to choose healthy foods to feed their families.

Ruby's Pantry

Sharing the Love of Christ through food every third Tuesday of the month at the Redwood Falls Armory.

What is Ruby's Pantry: To procure and distribute corporate surplus food and goods to help fight poverty, hunger and disease in rural communities in the United States.

Ruby's Pantry Mission Statement: To procure and distribute corporate surplus food and goods to help fight poverty, hunger and disease in rural communities in the United States for those with low resources and in crisis through churches, food shelves and other local civic organizations. To develop the "Blessing Box" concept to activate people in being alert to the needs of others and to be proactive in encouraging, showing friendship and meeting tangible needs of struggling neighbors, friends and strangers regardless of race, religion or ethnicity.

Ruby's Pantry had a wonderful year in 2018. December was our 55th distribution in Redwood Falls. With the help of our over 100 volunteers from throughout the community, including several high school/middle school sports teams, and scout troops, we were able to give out 2,662 shares. We had 1,068 registered guests in 2018, with the potential of helping over 4,000 people for the year. We were also able to give away left over food in the form of "blessing boxes" and to the WE Care program in Morgan. In addition, the church was able to benefit from the left over paper products and food for Wednesday night meals and Sunday morning breakfasts, as well as some food for the backpack programs at Reede Gray and Cedar Mountain.

Ruby's requires us to collect a \$20 donation per share from each guest, of which we keep 10% locally. Unfortunately, a large portion of that money we keep is put towards expenses such as rent at the armory and supplies. The remaining money we are able to give away. Every month we donate shares through the local Veteran's service office. We have made several other donations in 2018 such as; Share the Spirit, the Redwood Area Food Shelf, WE Care food shelf, we donated \$1000 to the Omaha mission trip, as well as gave out a \$500 senior scholarship, just to name a few.

Our community is very blessed to have Ruby's Pantry, and our church is fortunate to be leading it. Ruby's brings people of all walks of life in our community together. I feel the volunteers get the most out of it and for that I am thankful. Thank you to all of the volunteers who give so much each month.

Costa Rica

Omaha



I believe that mission trips are so important to be a part of. It is especially important for kids to experience life different from their own, to see how they can help others and to appreciate what they have. We did just that in Omaha this past weekend. My favorite part of going to Omaha was visiting the Sienna Francis House, a wet homeless shelter in a very rough part of Omaha. We served at this location both nights of the weekend.
