Pastor's Annual Report 2020

2020 was a strange year to say the least. As a pastor I try to get people to come to church and spend lots of time visiting in person with parishioners but alas the pandemic changed all the rules.

Facebook Live has been wonderful and yet challenging all at the same time. Sometimes the internet connection is poor, sometimes just fine. We are able to reach people in their very own homes and when we first started we saw numbers that were over eight hundred views per service. In polls it has been said the greatest competition to people attending church on Sunday is for people to be drinking a cup of coffee and reading the Sunday paper in their pajamas. Now people can do that and tune into service live or later on the Church Facebook page, You Tube or the access channels. Many people have said we must keep the Facebook Live Services even after we go back to worshiping in person. The pandemic pushed most churches into new technology which is ironic as churches are often the last place to use new technology.

Zoom Calls have become the new norm for Session Meetings, Committee Meetings, Presbytery Meetings, Presbytery Committee Meetings, Synod Committee meetings and General Assembly Committee meetings. Leaderwise has offered courses to pastors as to how to stay sane and pastor a church during a pandemic. We learned pastors have a much higher rate of health issues (high blood pressure, diabetes, obesity, and depression) than the general population as they take on everyone else's problems and issues. The Presbytery has offered times for pastors to gather, share ideas and support one another. Zoom has saved lots of time and money as people do not have to travel and meals do not have to be provided. Being on lots of zoom calls can become tedious at times even though it is a helpful tool during a pandemic.

It has been strange preaching to my phone in the sanctuary instead of people in the pews. As the vaccine makes its way across the population, I look forward to the day when we all can be together again and sing, pray and worship un-masked. It has been great to have our song leader Peggy Dolezal but it will be awesome to have the whole choir again.

It has been wonderful to see the creative things that have happened at church in the wake of the pandemic such as the food pantries at our church and in Morton, the clothing drive, the Christian Education projects for Easter, Mother's Day, Vacation Bible School and Christmas. The Mission Committee has continued to help people locally, regionally, nationally and internationally. Ruby's Pantry has adapted to doing things outdoors. The Piecemakers have still made quilts for baptisms and other occasions. Our Deacons and your pastor pray for our church family daily.

Thanks to all of your for continuing to support our church with your time, talent, finances, and prayer. You all are a valued part of the Body of Christ.

Presbyterian Youth

While we weren't able to serve our youth in our regular ways, we did provide a few special activities for them. Last spring we teamed up with Blossom Town Greenhouse and provided each family with a flat container, soil, 3 succulent plants, rocks, moss, 3 crosses and instructions to make a Resurrection Garden. Families shared pictures of their completed gardens on Facebook and we were so impressed by their creativity! We also offered a Mother's Day activity for families to pick up and do at home.

In late summer, we partnered with Gloria Dei Lutheran Church and provided "VBS in a Bag" for each child who registered. In the bag were 5 days of daily lessons, Bible verses, crafts and activities relating to the theme of how we, as Christians, can be peacemakers in our daily lives. Snacks and a few fun items were also included in each bag.

In early December, youth picked up Christmas card packets and sent greetings to many members of the congregation. We hope that their notes and drawings brought some smiles to others during the holiday season. As a Christmas gift, members of the Christian Ed committee designed an interactive activity for young children (2 years old -4th grade) and their parents to use together. Each family received a set of "Nativity Eggs - The Birth of Christ" which consisted of 12 eggs in a clear egg carton. In each egg is a tiny item(s) that signifies a part of the Christmas story. (angel, Mary/Joseph, donkey, shepherd's staff, manger, swaddling cloth, wise men, star, gift, gold/frankincense/myrrh, Baby Jesus) Also included in the carton was an insert with the Christmas story divided into 12 segments. As the parent reads each section of the story, the corresponding egg is opened. The intent of this gift is that it will become a family keepsake and that it will help families retell the Christmas story with one another for years to come.

At the very end of the year, a last minute idea to provide a virtual, mini Christmas program was introduced to families and a number did participate by singing familiar carols, reading narration sharing the Christmas story, and playing instruments. Church member and college student, Savannah Joldersma, provided the beautiful vocal and piano accompaniment in the video.

Youth Club

Youth Club started out strong in January 2020 when kids returned to Wednesday night activities, including recreation, music, study time, and sharing a meal together. Everyone enjoyed the night we met at the RACC to go ice skating and play in the field house. The week of Valentine's Day, we painted and decorated wooden heart boxes that were left over from a Ruby's Pantry distribution and given to the kids. The kids were able to sing at the Ash Wednesday service and the Lenten service the following week. And then, everything changed.

In mid- March, all church activities ended due to the pandemic. I don't think any of us imagined that we would not gather again in 2020. It has felt so strange to not have Youth Club. We missed preparing for all that goes into Youth Sunday- a message shared in songs, memory work, piano solos. We missed playing Sardines, 4 Corners, Bingo, Uno Attack, board games, doing puzzles, and hiking to Perk's Park. We missed sharing Bible story lessons and activities and doing service projects.. We missed learning, visiting, and laughing with one another. Perhaps what we missed the most, was sharing a traditional Christmas program with our church family.

We hope that our kids are eager to get back to Youth Club and we look forward to the time when we can gather together again!

2020 Outreach Committee Annual Report

The 2020 Outreach Committee: Moderator Sue Osborne, Joyce Nolting, Laura Kohler, Lois Davis, Valerie Stephens, Stephanie Klavetter, Shannon Sweetman

Our Mission Statement:

To reach beyond the walls of our Church to be a blessing to our community.

This was a busy year for Outreach, lots of changes and adjustments. Here are some highlights from our year:

Coffee After Church: Until COVID hit, we continued to serve coffee and snacks following church during fellowship time. We are saddened that this was discontinued because of the virus.

Flowers for Baptisms/Confirmands: We provided 7 flowers for baptisms & confirmands this year.

Ruby's Pantry: Starting in May, 2014, we have been working with sometimes more than 80 volunteers to provide food and household supplies to families in our area. This year, we have provided more than 4,000 bundles of food to families at low cost. Ten percent of the money collected stays in our local community, to be used for local missions. We have been able to support many organizations including area food shelves, Imagination Library, Share the Spirit, Apple Gourd Project, several foster and adoptive families, several families that experienced loss from house fires, sports scholarship for a child, paying a utility bill, girl scout troop supplies, gift certificates for local restaurants for community members, boy scout project support and many certificates for shares (bundles) to local veterans and other people in need. With COVID, our distribution moved outside and was held at Jackpot Junction for two months and at the Redwood County Fairgrounds. We appreciate the support of the county fair board.

Weekend Food Bags: We continue to provide weekend bags of food for elementary students. Along with the Methodist Church, we have delivered more than 1,200 bags throughout 2020. Thank you to all the families that helped back bags! This mission is funded by a very generous anonymous donor from our church and by other members donating food and money.

Imagination Library: Dolly Parton's Imagination Library is a book gifting program that mails free, high-quality books to children from birth until they begin school, no matter their family's income. After launching in 1995, the program grew quickly. First books were only distributed to children living in Sevier County, Tennessee where Dolly grew up. It became such a success that in 2000 a national replication effort was underway. More than 150 million books have been mailed to children in the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom, Australia and the Republic of Ireland. With large donations from the Rotary, the Lions' Club, Ruby's Pantry, and other donations from FPC members, Catholic Women and community members, we were able to provide 2,903 books to children in the Redwood Area. We continue to look for funding sources.

Food Pantry: The First Presbyterian Free Food Pantry became a reality shortly after covid entered our worlds in April 2020. We knew that there would be some families and individuals in our area that would be financially impacted by retail and hospitality being forced to change their business model due to state-mandated covid restrictions, essentially laying off most of their staff, in many cases. The first pantry was kick-started by one of the \$100 bills that were gifted to many individuals in our congregation at the end of 2019. The first pantry began very modestly, not seeing much use until September. So, we were able to stockpile food, mostly from the abundance that Ruby's Pantry provided each month and surplus from multiple food distributions at the Lower Sioux Community. We were also able to donate a truck-bed FULL to a charter school that was vandalized and rendered unusable in Minneapolis during the riots. We continued to see food and financial contributions come in, so in July, we opened a second pantry in Morton, between City Hall and Minnwest Bank. Use increased dramatically at the beginning of September, and our reserves slowly disappeared. The pantries are supported by "Matthew 25" and from community donations.

Winter-wear & Food Collection: When cold weather arrived the Outreach Committee put their heads together (not literally, cuz...covid), and it was decided that we should collect winter-wear, also. Coats, gloves, boot, caps, mittens, etc. have arrived during two curbside collections in front of the Church, the first on Saturday, December 19, the second on Monday, December 28. More than 100 coats were collected. Community distribution took place on Wednesday, December 30, from 3-7 pm. Leftover winter-wear is available for people near the outdoor food pantries for families and individuals to take what they need through the winter.

Highway Cleanup: Because of COVID, we have not been able to do highway cleanup this year, but plan to get back to it as soon as it is safe!

Presbytery Meeting: The Outreach committee was in charge of providing food for the attendees of the Presbytery. We planned, ordered and served snacks and lunch to the group, under the guidelines of Presbytery.

They support our vision and mission through these categories: Worship, Faith Formation, Pastoral Care, Mission, Information and Building & Grounds.

Worship: Spiritual leadership is a major focus for Pastor Scott. Preparing for and conducting worship services, including the Sacraments, planning a funeral or other special services, takes a great deal of time each week. Sermon preparation, selecting and writing worship prayers, information to share in the bulletin, With Tina, preparing and printing the bulletins are just a few of the ways that time is spent during the week. We are thankful for the time Elaine and Peggy and volunteers put in to bring the gift of music to our worship services. This essential time spent by our staff is designed to bring us all together to joyously worship our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. And to help us connect with our faith community.

Faith Formation: Coordinating the continuing education of our children, youth and adults happens through staff and volunteers. Planning and going on mission trips and being intimately involved in our Sunday School and Youth Club program are just a couple examples of how Scott and Pam are involved in faith formation. This year has been very different than what we have done in the past. Many of those projects are being done different now and some are on hold. Tina works behind the scenes to support the staff and volunteers through ordering supplies, creating documents and other requests as needed. And our custodian gets to come in after and refresh the areas where all these activities take place. Thanks Pam for all the years you worked tirelessly to help build the faith of the children who participated in Sunday School and Youth Club.

Pastoral Care: Staying connected and caring for our church family is an important part of Scott's time. Home visits, hospital and nursing home visits were regular activities during the early months of the year, and have moved to more time spent on the phone and through Zoom calls.

Mission: As a tithing congregation we support international, national, regional and local mission projects. Scott and Tina, along with congregation members spend time behind the scenes using the funds from our tithes or special donations to make sure the funds are

dispersed as needed. Knowing where needs are and helping us with the numbers are essential to making important decisions about how best to meet the needs of those we serve. Information. All of the staff are involved in sharing what is happening within and outside of the church building through the bulletin, The Chimes, emails, our website and Facebook page. This all takes time to pull together and distribute by Tina and Scott.

Building & Grounds: It has been a year of transitions for our custodial staff. Each of the people involved in the role of custodian and many volunteers work very hard to maintain the building and grounds. Repair, maintenance, cleaning, and other needs are important ways to show that we care for and respect the beautiful building where we come together to worship, support faith formation, offer pastoral care, support mission projects and conduct the day to day business of the congregation. We look forward to when it can bring more of us together than is currently safe to do.

Updates: We try to meet with all of the staff in the fall to talk about any challenges for the year and what we can do to help them do their jobs better. We were able to meet with Pastor Scott in November. And will be meeting with the others in January.

We thank Nathan Zimmerman, Custodian, for staying on throughout the year to help train two different people who filled and fill the role now.

Due to Covid-19 guidelines, in 2020 we served no funeral receptions.

Our current operation consists of two work teams. One team has been responsible for setting the tables, decorating the dining area, preparing the beverages. This preparation team is flexible, giving people who are not available to help during the funeral reception the opportunity to volunteer. The second team is the volunteers who serve and clean up at the funeral reception. We generally have the meals catered.

To say that 2020 was an unusual year for Church finances would be a gross understatement!!

The year began calmly enough and later changed a little with a few Corvid warning clouds appearing on the horizon in Mid-February. A full-fledged pandemic came on us a short month later and Church life as we were used to came to a rapid halt. With Sunday services changed to remote worshipping, we wondered how our Church finances would be affected?

Early on with the pandemic, the Stewardship Committee became proactive and made a Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan application with the Bremer Bank. This loan was to be used to ward off possible employee layoffs due to the pandemic. We received a loan of \$23,664 and as of the end of the year, we are hopeful that this loan will be forgiven by our Federal Government and no payback will be necessary.

For a long time, we were not meeting for worship on Sundays: so, donations were collected through the mail with Richard Aakre and Tina Halvorson both counting and keeping track of the donations. Deb Hess continued to balance our checking account on a monthly basis.

All the while we were not holding services on a weekly basis, our Church continued to operate on a somewhat limited basis and our expenses continued to come in. Thank God – so did our donations!! The staff, Session and the individual committees did a great job - where they could – of keeping our expenses down to a bare minimum. A quick summary of our 2020 finances will prove this out:

2020 was the year that the Endowment Fund really started to perform like an Endowment Fund. Our \$133,000 invested with Thrivent Financial was giving us good interest dividends of around \$6,000. We also have a growth fund that is growing as the stock market improves but does not give us much for dividends.

A quick review of how our earnings are spent may be useful here. The earnings are divided into four groups that have the responsibility of wisely choosing projects to fund. The four areas are: Missions, Properties, Special Needs and a combination of Worship, Christian Education and Outreach. Last year a total of \$1,933.63 was given out by the Endowment Fund.

Some of the projects funded included: Missions – a Christmas donation to Share the Spirit; Worship: provided a hotel room for guest speaker, Worship Bags at Christmas and Colored Sunday Church Service Brochures when regular church service resumes; Special needs: freezer meals and gift cards to an area family and Native American books & literature for area jails.
