



PER-CAPITA

The Per-Capita is the cost to our church for us, as individuals, for being members of the Presbyterian Church. In 2025, our church will pay \$46 for each of us to be a Presbyterian!

Where does this money go? Part of this money goes to the Presbytery to help pay their day-to-day expenses, and part of it goes to the Synod and to the General Assembly for the same reasons. The per-capita costs are what pays salaries and keeps the doors open for all three level of the Presbyterian church.

Douglas "Doug" Archie Jensen, age 87 of Redwood Falls and Apache Junction, AZ, passed away peacefully surrounded by family Thursday, July 10, 2025. Memorial Services was held on Thursday, July 17. Doug Jensen was born in Morgan, MN to Archie and Lilian (Meierding) Jensen on August 29, 1937. He was baptized and confirmed in the Methodist Church in Sleepy Eye. Doug was an athlete at an early age and competed in football, basketball, baseball, track and field throughout his school years. He also worked with his father hauling milk from local dairy farms to the

creamery. He graduated from Sleepy Eye High School in 1955. Doug continued his education at Mankato State University where he earned his teaching and then counseling degrees and competed in the long jump on the MSU track team. Doug started his career as a high school social studies teacher, school counselor, and coach in Nicollet, MN. One of his favorite accomplishments was his football team being undefeated in his final year of coaching. He remained very close to many of his players and students throughout his entire life.

One of Doug's primary passions has been horses since the day he met his beloved wife of 60+ years, Kay Diane Palmer, at a trail ride. The two were married on July 25, 1964, at the First Presbyterian Church in Redwood Falls. They passed on their love of horses to their children and grandchildren. The entire family has been active in the Western Saddle Clubs Association, the South Central Saddle Clubs Association, and several saddle clubs. Doug was proud to serve as a WSCA Judge, Board of Directors' President, and MN State Fair Ring Steward for many years. He and Kay were well respected leaders in the horse show world. They were named SCSCA Horse People of the Year, the WSCA Championship Show was dedicated in their honor, and Doug received special recognition for his 50+ years of devoted service to WSCA.

After moving back to Redwood Falls with his family, Doug became a farmer and ran a trucking company. He enjoyed playing cards, cheering on all of his favorite sports teams, attending horse shows, and wintering in Arizona where he would sit on the deck in his rocking chair and talk to everyone who passed by. He also made sure to attend as many of his granddaughters' sports and school events as he could.

Doug is survived by his wife Kay; children: Lynne (Dean) Jensen-Nelson, Lori (Paul) Jensen Hagert and Lacy Kieffer; granddaughters: Lily and Lana Kieffer; and many friends and relatives. He is preceded in death by his parents and sister Gloria Schwerzler.

How can we be the best disciple for Jesus Christ during our time on earth?

Being the best disciple for Jesus Christ during our time on earth means following His teachings with sincerity, humility, courage, and love. Here are key ways to live that out:

- **1. Love God and Others Wholeheartedly:** Jesus said the greatest commandments are to love God with all our heart, soul, and mind, and to love our neighbors as ourselves (Matthew 22:37–40). This is the foundation of discipleship. Prioritize daily time with God in prayer, Scripture, and reflection. Let your love be active—caring for the hurting, forgiving enemies, welcoming the outcast.
- 2. Follow Jesus' Example: Jesus lived with compassion, justice, mercy, and truth. He: Served others, especially the poor, sick, and marginalized. Spoke out against hypocrisy and injustice. Gave generously of Himself—even to the point of death. To follow Him is to imitate Him in your daily choices, relationships, and responses to the world.
 - 3. Live by the Spirit: Galatians 5:22–23 says the fruit of the Spirit—love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control—should define our lives. Let the Spirit guide your actions, decisions, and character.
- 4. Practice Humble Obedience: Discipleship isn't about perfection—it's about surrender. Jesus said, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23). Be willing to give up comfort, status, or possessions for the sake of the Gospel. Trust God's call, even when it leads into hard or unfamiliar places.
- **5. Be a Peacemaker and Justice-Seeker:** Jesus said, "Blessed are the peacemakers" (Matthew 5:9). Disciples are called to: Stand with the oppressed. Speak up for what is right. Build bridges in a divided world.
- 6. Grow in Community: Discipleship is not a solo journey. Be part of a faith community that prays, worships, learns, and serves together. Encourage one another in faith. Learn from those who are different from you. Be accountable and open to growth.
 - 7. Share the Good News: A disciple is also a witness. Jesus told His followers to go and make disciples (Matthew 28:19). Share the love, truth, and hope of Christ in word and action. Live a life that reflects the Gospel. Tell your story of faith. Invite others into the journey of knowing Jesus.
- **8. Keep Growing Spiritually:** Never stop learning, praying, or seeking God. Read Scripture regularly, engage in spiritual disciplines, and ask the hard questions. Let doubt lead you deeper, not farther away. Trust that God is shaping you, even in struggle.
- **9. Embody Gratitude and Hope:** Let your life be a testimony to the goodness of God. Live with joy, even in trial. Trust that Christ is making all things new.
- **10. Finish Well:** Our time on earth is limited. Being a faithful disciple means living each day with purpose and integrity so that at the end, we can hear Christ say, "Well done, good and faithful servant" (Matthew 25:23).

Prayer for Discipleship:

Loving Christ, shape me into a true disciple—courageous in faith, generous in love, faithful in service, and bold in witness. Use my time on earth for Your glory. Let my life reflect You in all I do. Amen.
