#### A Season of Gratitude and New Beginnings

Twenty-three and a half years is more than a span of time—it is a shared life. It is countless Sundays of worship, prayers spoken aloud and whispered quietly, tears shed and laughter shared, questions asked and faith deepened. As I prepare to move into a new church setting at the end of January, my heart is filled with deep gratitude for this congregation and for the sacred journey we have walked together.

When I first arrived, none of us could have fully imagined what these years would hold. Together we have celebrated baptisms and confirmations, weddings and anniversaries. We have stood beside one another at hospital beds and gravesides, trusting God's promises even when words felt inadequate. We have welcomed new members, said difficult goodbyes, weathered changes in the world and in the church, and discovered again and again that God's grace is sufficient for each season.

Ministry has never been something done by one person alone. It has always been something we have shared. Worship leaders, musicians, teachers, session and deacon members, volunteers, caregivers, prayer warriors, and quiet servants behind the scenes—each of you has been part of this ministry. The faithfulness of this congregation is written not only in programs or accomplishments, but in relationships, compassion, and the steady commitment to love God and neighbor.

There have been moments of great joy and moments of deep sorrow. Through all of it, this congregation has shown resilience, generosity, and faith. You have taught me what it means to be present with people in all stages of life. You have trusted me with your stories, your hopes, and your grief, and that trust has been one of the greatest gifts of my ministry.

As this chapter comes to a close, it is natural to feel a mixture of emotions—gratitude, sadness, uncertainty, and hope. Transitions are rarely easy, but they are often holy. Scripture reminds us that God is always doing something new, even when we cannot yet see the full picture. This moment is not an ending as much as it is a turning of the page.

For this congregation, a new season is beginning. New leadership will bring new energy, new ideas, and new ways of responding to God's call. The gifts that have shaped this community for generations will continue, even as new gifts emerge. The same God who has been faithful in the past will remain faithful in the future.

For me, this transition is also a step of trust—trust in God's guidance and in the strength of this congregation to continue its ministry with confidence and hope. I leave knowing that this church is grounded in faith, compassion, and a deep love for Christ. I go carrying with me the lessons, memories, and relationships that have shaped me over these 23 ½ years.

There are not enough words to fully express my thanks. Thank you for your prayers, your patience, your encouragement, and your partnership in ministry. Thank you for allowing me to walk with you through life's most sacred moments. Thank you for being the church—not just a place, but a people who seek to follow Jesus with open hearts.

As we step into what comes next, may we do so with gratitude for what has been and confidence in what God will yet do. May this time of transition be a reminder that God's work among us continues, always inviting us into new beginnings.
