

Ordination and Installation of Officers

Sentence of Scripture

L: There are varieties of gifts, but is the same Spirit who gives them.

P: There are different ways of serving God, but it is the same Lord who is served.

L: God works through each person in a unique way, but it is God's purpose that is accomplished.

P: To each is given a gift of the Spirit to be used for the common good.

L: Together we are the body of Christ, and individually members of it.

Statement of Ordination

L: We are all called into the church of Jesus Christ by baptism and marked as Christ's own by the Holy Spirit. This is our common calling, to be disciples of Jesus Christ and servants of our servant Lord. Within the community of the church, some are called to a particular service as deacons, as ruling elders, and ministers of the Word and Sacrament. Ordination is Christ's gift to the church, assuring that his ministry continues among us. Through ordination, God provides for acts of care and compassion in the world, for the ordering and governance of the church, and for the preaching of the word and celebration of the sacraments.

Ruling Elder Robert Alexander: Representing the one holy catholic and apostolic church, the session of First Presbyterian Church now ordains and installs Gene Schultz as a ruling elder and Amber Kleinhuizen as a deacon. The session also installs to active service those who have been previously ordained including deacons Adrienne Danielson, Mike Bentson, Shannon Sweetman and ruling elders Shawn Corder and Rick Hauge.

Profession of Faith

L: As God calls some to particular forms of ministry, God calls us all to bear gladly the yoke of Christ given in the covenant of Baptism. Let us, therefore, reaffirm our baptismal vows, renouncing all that opposes God and God's rule and affirming the faith of the holy catholic church.

L: Trusting in the gracious mercy of God, do you turn from the ways of sin and renounce evil and its power in the world?

Candidates: I do.

L: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Lord and Savior, trusting in his grace and love?

Candidates: I do.

L: Will you be Christ's faithful disciple, obeying his Word and showing his love?

Candidates: I will, with God's help.

L: With the whole church, let us confess our faith.

L: Do you believe in God the Father?

Congregation: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

L: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

Congregation: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

L: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

Congregation: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Constitutional Questions

L: Rick, Shawn, Gene, Amber, Adrienne, Shannon, Mike, in baptism, you were claimed by the love of God, clothed in the grace of Jesus Christ, and anointed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit to share Christ's mission in the world.

L: Now you are called by God through the voice of the church for new service and ministry in Jesus' name. In accordance with the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A), show your commitment to this calling by responding to these questions:

L: Do you trust in the Lord Jesus Christ your Savior, acknowledge him Lord of all and Head of the Church, and through him believe in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?

Candidates: I do.

L: Do you accept the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be, by the Holy Spirit, the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the Church universal, and God's Word to you?

Candidates: I do.

L: Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God?

Candidates: I do and I will.

L: Will you fulfill your ministry in obedience to Jesus Christ, under the authority of Scripture, and be continually guided by our Confessions?

Candidates: I will

L: Will you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit?

Candidates: I will

L: Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world?

Candidates: I will.

L: Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the church?

Candidates: I do.

L: Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love?

Candidates: I will.

L: For Deacons, Will you be a faithful deacon, teaching charity, urging concern, and directing the people's help to the friendless and those in need, and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus

Christ?

Deacon Candidates: I will.

L: For Ruling Elders, will you be a faithful ruling elder, watching over the people, providing for their worship, nurture and service? Will you share in government and discipline, serving in councils of the church, and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

Elder Candidate: I will

Robert Alexander: Do we the members of the church, accept Shawn Corder, Rick Hauge, Gene Shultz as ruling elders and Shannon Sweetman, Michael Bentson, Amber Kleinhuizen as Deacons, chosen by God through the voice of this congregation to lead us in the way of Jesus Christ?

Congregation: We do.

Robert Alexander: Do agree to pray for them, to encourage them, to respect their decisions and to follow as they guide us, serving Jesus Christ, who alone is Head of the Church?

Congregation: We do.

Prayer of Ordination and Installation

L: I invite all ordained Ruling Elders, Deacons and Ministers of the Word and Sacrament to come forward for the laying on of hands as we ordain Amber Kleinhuizen as deacon and Gene Shultz as a ruling elder. Amber and Gene please kneel if able.

L: The Lord be with you.

P: And also, with you.

L: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

P: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

L: Gracious and eternal God, with joy we give you thanks and praise. Throughout the ages and in every place, you have chosen servants from among your people to point the way to salvation by your grace. We are grateful for ancestors in the faith who followed without fear, placing their trust in you alone, for judges and monarchs who ruled in righteousness and peace; for prophets and apostles who spoke your bold words of mercy and truth; for leaders and teachers in every age who have nurtured your people in faith and faithfulness. Above all, we praise you for Jesus Christ, who came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life to set others free. Anointed by your Holy Spirit, he proclaimed your reign on earth, revealing your saving love in all he said and did.

L: Gracious God, pour out your Spirit upon your servants Amber and Gene whom you have called by baptism as your own. Grant them the same mind that was in Christ Jesus.

L: Gracious God, we also give you thanks for your servants, Rick, Shawn, Adrienne, Shannon and Mike as they continue in the ministry to which you have called them. Help them to rely on the gifts of your Spirit and to follow Christ faithfully in this calling.

L: Give them a spirit of truthfulness that they may show the compassion of Christ in the actions of daily living and rightly govern your people.

Ruling Elder Robert Alexander: Gracious God, pour your Spirit of power and truth upon the whole church, that we may be for you a holy people baptized to serve you in the world. Sustain your church in ministry. Ground us in the gospel, secure our hope in Christ, strengthen our service to the outcast, and increase our love for one another. Show us the transforming power of your grace in our life together, that we may be effective servants of the gospel, offering a compelling witness in the world to the good news of Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen. Lois, you may stand up.
