As you all know, we have a wonderful project in the works happening locally, a new addition is being built onto our library targeting the young people in the area.

Fundraising has been happening for some time and the building is going on now, just stop by the library sometime and take a look. Funds are still needed, however. A new library addition needs new furnishings, and that is the focus on fundraising now. You can walk into the library to see what the new furnishing will look like.

For many years now our church, through the Mission Committee, has donated money to the Our Lady of Guadalupe Free Clinic (OLGFC) in Worthington, Minnesota. This spring we were able to donate another \$500 to further the essential and faithful work of this charity.

OLGFC serves uninsured and under-insured patients across the southwestern part of our state. The clinic is a Christian mission that was started in 2011 by Fr. James Callahan and his friend Dr. Dave Plevak. Over 500 patients are served yearly by OLGFC. Unfortunately, 2026 has seen an increase in need for the clinic's services and, accordingly, for donations. Jesus tells us that whenever we care for the sick, we care for Him (Matthew 25:36). Thank you for your faithful giving. It enables our church family to support our vulnerable neighbors in need of medical care.

In Christ, The Mission Committee

(ZCC) is a ministry of Zion Lutheran Church in the Midway neighborhood of St. Paul. The neighborhood is one of the poorest in the Twin Cities and many residents suffer from food insecurity. ZCC serves fresh, free, community meals twice weekly. They also host a food distribution twice a week. This winter ZCC donated and delivered thousands of pounds of food to neighbors in need.

Our church was recently able to donate \$500 to Zion Community Commons. Thank you for supporting this important urban food ministry. Whenever we feed the hungry, we feed Jesus! (Matthew 25: 35)

Wayne G. Mann

October 11, 1945 – March 25, 2026

Born on October 11, 1945, Wayne's life was a portrait of dedication, hard work, and a passion for the simple joys that colored his world.

A proud graduate of Redwood Falls High School in 1963,

Wayne embarked on a life journey that exemplified commitment both to his country and his craft. Serving honorably in the Air Force during the Vietnam War from 1965 to 1967, Wayne carried the values of courage and perseverance throughout his life. Following his military service, he became a self-employed drywaller, dedicating 48 years to mastering his trade before retiring in 2015. His hands built more than walls; they built a legacy of integrity and resilience that echoes through those who knew him.

On March 22, 1969, Wayne married Sharon Koenig at the First Presbyterian Church in Redwood Falls, and they made their home in Redwood Falls. In 1978, the couple moved to Wabasso, where they have lived since. Wayne was also a lifetime member of the First Presbyterian Church in Redwood Falls. Wayne's heart found joy beyond his work in the great outdoors and lively adventures. He loved to hunt and fish, savoring the quiet moments and the connection to nature that these activities offered. He also enjoyed trips to the casino, where his laughter and good spirit left lasting impressions on friends and companions alike. He is survived by his cherished son, Scott Mann of Wabasso, and his devoted daughter, Deborah (Mann) Gieseke of Willmar. Wayne's life was enriched by many nieces and nephews, along with a broad circle of family and friends who will dearly miss his warmth and companionship.

Wayne was preceded in death by his loving parents, Ralph and Lois (Lechner) Mann; his dear wife, Sharon Lee (Koenig) Mann, who passed away in 2016; brothers James Mann, Robert Mann, and Gerald Mann; and sister Marianne Waidelich. Their memories remain a treasured part of his story.

As we gather to remember Wayne, we celebrate a life marked by steadfast devotion, joyful spirit, and enduring love. His legacy remains alive in the hearts of those who knew him, a testament to a man who lived fully and loved deeply. Wayne G. Mann will be profoundly missed but never forgotten.
